Article 39 - Church members are not responsible for obligations contracted by their representatives in name of the Church. Article 40 - Should there be a division of the Church, Church Property will remain with the party which remains faithful to the doctrine set forth in the "Declaration of Faith". Sole paragraph - Should both parties remain faithful to the doctrine, the Property will belong to the faction which retains the majority of members. Article 41 - Should the Church be dissolved, all Property will be passed on to the São Paulo Baptist Convention. Article 42 - The present By-laws recognize the legal nature of all acts undertaken previously by the Church and may only be amended at an extraordinary meeting and will come into effect immediately after their registration and the competent publication in the "Diário Oficial" (Official Daily Gazette) of the state of São Paulo. São Paulo, 16th of September 1950 (signed): Antonio Garcia Gimenez - Church President". - The foregoing is truth and I attest to this effect. São Paulo, twenty-fourth (24th) of September of the year one thousand, nine hundred and fifty-eight (1958). Second designated sub-officer, [signed].

which have been entrusted to him/her; c) - depositing with the "Caixa Econômica" or credit institutions, in the Church's name, as the Church designates, the contributions which are needed for the day to day running expenses or which belong to special funds; e) - making the payments which he/she has been authorized to settle by the Church, filing all of the respective invoices and receipts; f) - supplying the Board and church with all information that is requested, making all books available for examination and g) - reading before the Church the monthly and annual reports. Article 21 - The function of the 2nd treasurer is to substitute the 1st treasurer whenever the latter is incapacitated and provide him/her with support whenever the 1st treasurer should so determine. Article 22 - the deacons' responsibilities include: a) - taking part in all Board meetings; b) - taking up the positions of 1st and 2nd Treasurers; c) - composing and administrating the Benefit Fund; d) - meeting regularly, at least every two months; e) - looking after property upkeep; f) - distributing the Lord's Supper and raising collections and g) - helping the Pastor to uphold order during worship. Article 23 - The voting members' responsibilities are: a) - taking part in all Board meetings and b) - presenting monthly reports. Article 24 - Any Board action will be declared null and void if not previously approved by the Church. Article 25 - Any member, in a Board or Church meeting, may make known his/her protest to actions that he/she considers to be illegal or against the present By-laws. Article 26 - The Board will meet at the Church's place of worship, regularly or extraordinarily, at least once per month or whenever the Church's interests require it. Article 27 - The Board will declare vacant the places of members who do not appear at meetings with due regularity and who cannot present just cause for their absence. Article 28 - The Board will inform the church of any vacant place or places which have come up on the Board, whether such places are a result of the previous Article or a result of change of address, death or resignation by any of its members. Article 29 - The Church may, at any time, fill the vacant places on the Board or elect a new one when required by special circumstances. - Chapter IV - Meetings - Article 30 - Church meetings are considered to be: a) - one ordinary, monthly meeting, on a date established by the Church to receive members, discuss dismissal letters, discipline, reading, Minutes, correspondence, reports and any other business of interest to the Church and which contributes to the growth of the Kingdom of God; b) - one ordinary annual meeting, in December, following the ordinary monthly meeting, to elect the new Board and approve the internal department and congregation directors; c) - an ordinary session on Vigil Night, 31st of December, to present the yearly reports and Board members taking office; d) - an ordinary meeting in January to approve the Church's, departments' and congregations' annual reports; e) - extraordinary meetings, for special purposes, whenever the Board or the Church considers them to be necessary. Sole paragraph - The inclusion or exclusion of members shall only take place in ordinary monthly meetings or meetings called for this specific purpose. Article 31 - Meetings will be deemed to have a quorum with any number of members. Sole paragraph - Exception will be made for the December and January meetings and for those meetings called for elections, dismissal or judgment of accusations made against Pastor or Pastors, Deacons and the Board as a whole or in part, to discuss deviations or changes of these By-laws; in all of these situations there will be a proclamation from the pulpit and a memorandum fixed in a visible place two Sundays in advance. Article 32 - Rules to be adopted in such meetings shall be the same ones adopted at parliamentary meetings. Article 33 - The Church's attributions and duties when meeting in session are: a) - to elect the Board and approve the congregation and internal department elections; b) - to consider the actions of these bodies; c) - to authorize and approve ordinary and extraordinary expenses; d) - to dismiss the Board or any of its members when they do not fulfill their statutory duties as set forth in these By-laws; e) - to dismiss the internal department Boards and elect others; f) - to initiate criminal proceedings against the Board or its members when either have acted fraudulently and affected Church property or damaged Church credit; g) - to examine candidates for baptism, to receive members, admonish them, expel them, give transfer letters, and elect commissions and Convention messengers; h) - to elect and dismiss Pastors and Deacons; i) - to call extraordinary meetings or take any initiatives in accordance with the New Testament and j) - to name the Accounts Audit Committee. Chapter V - Elections - Article 34 - Elections for Pastor, Vice-president, Deacons, First Treasurer and First Secretary and Sunday School Supervisor shall always be by secret ballot. Article 35 - No member may be elected to any administrative or Church position in general without belonging to the Church or being commissioned by it. Chapter VI - The Accounts Audit Committee - Article 36 - This commission will be elected at the last ordinary monthly meeting of the year, and is elected to: a) - examine all congregation, department and Church Treasury accounts; b) - give a trustworthy report to the Church at the January session. - Chapter VII - Property - Article 37 - Church property is made up of: a) -

situations which may come about in the development of the Kingdom of God; c) - take part in worship meetings, Bible studies, Gospel preaching, ordinary and extraordinary meetings and other activities of the Church or congregation; d) - faithfully carry out any office for which a member is elected and takes up. Article 8 - Member subject to denunciation or exclusion who: a) - conduct their private, ecclesiastical or public lives in a manner contrary to the morality of the Gospel; b) - completely abandon the Church and maintain no periodic communication with the Church; c) - infringe these bylaws and other official Church resolutions. Article 9 - Any member will be excluded unless previously, and whenever possible, heard and visited by the Church. Article 10 - Any member who comes to be excluded will lose all rights previously enjoyed as a result of their communion with the Church. Sole paragraph: Any person who, in carrying out their duties, has in their possession or under their responsibility Church valuables, be they money, fixed or other assets, books or other items, is obliged to return such items immediately or within the deadline as determined by the Church, and that person will be held legally responsible for any losses which he/she may cause to Church property. Article 11 - Any member who is excluded and who repents of the fault or faults which caused their exclusion and returns, requesting reconciliation, may be readmitted and will enjoy all rights as before, without prejudice to that which is set forth in Article 8. Article 12 - Any member judging that he/she has been unjustly excluded and that the Church has acted as a result of erroneous information, may request to be allowed entry into a meeting to present a defense or request the naming of a commission totally independent of his/her exclusion, to which he/she will explain his/her reasons for such a request. The Church, however, is not under the obligation to accede to such a request and will proceed in accordance with the determinations set forth in the Article 5 sole paragraph. Chapter III - Administration - Article 13 - The administration of assets, of whatever shape or form and resulting from all Church activities, will be conducted by a Board composed of: One president, One vice-president, two secretaries (1st and 2nd), two treasurers (1st and 2nd), the deacons and all internal department and congregation presidents who will act as voting members. Paragraph 1 - The Church Pastor, as a consequence of his position, is Church and Board president. Paragraph 2 - To preserve the harmony of the divine calling to serve as a deacon, only those deacons who have already been recognized may be elected to the positions of 1st and 2nd treasurer, and only if these are unable to take up the position will other members be chosen, preference being given to those who have already been selected for the office of deacon. Article 14 - The Board has a yearly mandate, taking office on 31st of December. Article 15 - The scope of the Board's authority includes: a) - complying with and ensuring compliance with these By-laws and all official Church resolutions; b) - finding solutions to situations not foreseen by the present By-laws and submitting such solutions to the Church for approval; c) - creating the book-keeping ledgers; d) - calling ordinary and extraordinary meetings; e) - looking after the Church's assets; f) - authorizing acceptance of donations or bequests made to the Church; g) - authorizing the payment of extraordinary or regular expenses; h) - hiring and dismissing employees, and determining their salaries and responsibilities; i) - rendering accounts or information to the Church upon demand and j) - presenting written reports annually. Article 16 - The President's functions include: a) - carrying out the spiritual functions established in the New Testament for pastors, such as: preaching, ministering, counseling, visiting, baptizing and offering the Lord's Supper; b) - representing the Church in court and out of court; c) - holding the deciding vote in meetings except in those circumstances set forth in the sole paragraph of Article 4; d) - initialing the Church's books; e) - supervising all Church activities; f) - drawing up its annual report; g) - calling Board meetings and, on the Board's command, Church meetings; h) - opening, running and closing Board and church meetings; i) - signing jointly with the treasurer and secretary the mortgage, purchase and sale deeds, receipts, contracts and all important church documents; j) - instituting the new Board. Article 17 - The function of the Vice-president is to substitute the President whenever the latter is incapacitated. Sole paragraph - Should the Vice-president become incapacitated, the Church will name one of its deacons in his/her place. Article 18 - The 1st secretary's functions include: a) - drawing up and signing all of the minutes of Church and Board meetings; b) - organizing and maintaining these under his/her custody and archive; c) - drawing up and signing all Board and Church correspondence; d) - keeping rigorously up to date the book which contains the Members' Roster; e) - signing Church documents jointly with the president and Treasurer and f) presenting his/her annual report. Article 19 - The function of the 2nd secretary is to substitute the 1st secretary whenever the latter is incapacitated and provide him/her with support whenever the 1st secretary should so determine. Article 20 - The 1st treasurer's functions include: a) - signing documents relative to his/her position jointly with the President and the Secretary; b) - keeping in his/her custody Church money, documents and books

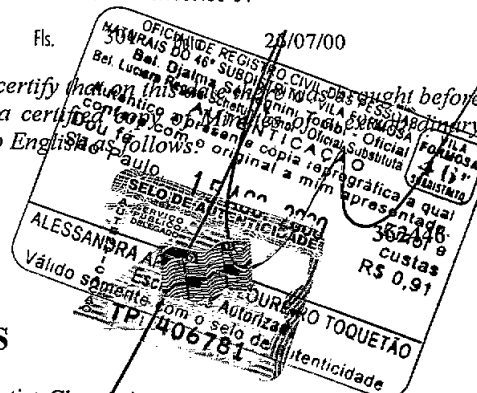
that, in accordance with federal decree no. 4857, of 9th November 1939, the By-laws of the "Baptist Church of Vila Formosa" were registered, on the twenty-fourth (24th) of October of the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty (1950), under order number 2284 (two thousand, two hundred and eighty-four) in book A number 2 of Legal Entity Register, a copy of which is found in our files, whose complete content is as follows: - "Baptist Church in Vila Formosa - São Paulo - Chapter 1 - The nature and purpose of the church - Article 1 - The Baptist church - in Vila Formosa - São Paulo, is a religious community - founded on 25th December 1949, with its seat based at Rua 40, no. 95, in this Capital, and is composed of an unlimited number of members, without discrimination on the basis of gender, nationality, race, or politics. Article 2 - This church, in accordance with the biblical nature of its organization, has adopted and maintains the "Declaration of Faith" of the Baptist Churches of the Brazilian Baptist Convention, as set forth in the book "What Baptists Believe". Article 3 - The Church recognizes Jesus Christ as its supreme leader and for its government, in terms of faith, worship, discipline and conduct, follows only the Bible, this being a fully democratic government, exercised by all Church members in ordinary or extraordinary meetings. Article 4 - The purposes of the Church are: a) - to meet on a regular basis for the worship and adoration of God in Spirit and in Truth, and in its place of worship there will be prayer meetings, Bible studies and preaching of the Gospel; b) - care for the religious development of its members, as well as their moral and spiritual conduct; c) - contribute to the edification of God's Kingdom on Earth, making efforts to spread the Gospel locally, nationally and internationally; d) - contribute to the establishment and maintenance of schools, places of worship, seminaries and whatever other institutions that may eventually contribute to the Evangelical cause; e) - foster charity, brotherhood and co-operation with Churches which possess the same faith and order and maintain cordial relations with other evangelical denominations, when doing so does not necessarily involve disobedience of any Biblical precept; f) - ordain pastors and deacons. - Chapter II - Members of the Church - Article 5 - Members of the Church are: a) - candidates received following a public profession of faith made before the Church, or, when not in its place of worship, and in exceptional circumstances, before those Church representatives who are duly commissioned and baptized under Church auspices; b) - the members of Churches of the same faith and order and who are received bearing transfer letters; c) those who have sought reconciliation; d) the members of extinct Baptist Churches, following declaration and inquiry; sole paragraph - candidates shall only be admitted following a unanimous vote. Article 6 - Members' rights are: a) to advise on and exercise Christian vigilance; b) to vote and be voted for in the pursuit of administrative positions and whatever other ecclesiastical activities; c) to appeal to the church to defend the fulfillment of their rights or the rights of others, when under legal authorization; d) - to suggest plans, propose exclusions, support and discuss proposals; e) - to represent the Church. - Duties - Article 7 - The members' duties are: a) - behave towards the Church and its congregation in a Bible-abiding manner; b) - contribute regularly towards expenses which include worship, sustenance of the ministry, preaching of the Gospel and all other
