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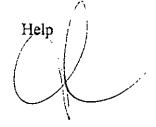

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE LIVE WILDLY FOUNDATION, INC. A FLORIDA NOT FOR PROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE_1

Name

ARTICLE 4

Board of Directors

Powers

The Corporation shall have all the powers given to a not-for-profit corporation by the Florida Statutes, to the extent consistent with these Articles of Incorporation and the bylaws the Corporation. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence, commencing upon filing.

ARTICLE 11

Indemnification

The Corporation shall indemnify any officer or director, or any former officer or director.

Bylaws

The initial board of directors shall adopt initial bylaws of the Corporation. The power to alter, amend or repeal the bylaws, or to adopt new bylaws, shall be vested in the board of directors of the Corporation.

ARTICLE 13

Distribution of Assets

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its charitable purpose. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE 15

Avoidance of Private Foundation Taxes

The Corporation is prohibited from engaging in any act of self-dealing, from retaining any excess business holdings, from making or retaining any investments, and from making any taxable expenditures, that would subject the Corporation or any person to tax under Sections 4941(d), 4943, 4944, or 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, respectively, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal income tax law to tax and the corporation shall make distributions at such time and in such manner as not to subject the corporation shall make distributions at such time and in such manner as not to subject the corporation shall make distributions at such time and in such manner as not to subject the corporation of any subsequent federal income tax law.
