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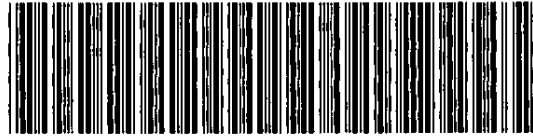

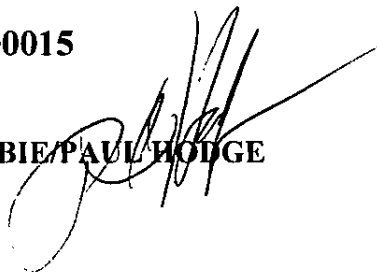

The undersigned, as President of OAKLEY SIGNS & GRAPHICS, INC., a Florida corporation (the "Corporation"), desiring to amend the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation pursuant to Section 607.1006 of the Florida Business Corporation Act, states as follows:


1. The name of the Corporation is OAKLEY SIGNS & GRAPHICS, INC.
2. The Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation are amended by deleting Article I in its entirety and inserting the following Article I in its place and stead:

Article I

"The name of the corporation is OAKLEY SIGNS & GRAPHICS DESIGN, INC."

3. The amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation was approved by a joint unanimous consent of the board of directors and shareholders of the Corporation on December 18, 2009.
